Carolina Corona is a fine art painter living in North Carolina. She started her art career as an art instructor in the public school system. She is a young art entrepreneur who exhibits in galleries across the state and participates in seasonal art shows/festivals. She also teaches private art lessons. Her passion for art and the environment has taken her to do pro-bono work with multiple local organizations including environmental and mental health associations. Her work reflects the beauty of her surroundings, embraces the concept of women in nature, and discusses freedom through the natural. In addition, her paintings depict images from her travels in detailed and colorful acrylic and watercolor strokes.

We asked our AFAS artists what they had been doing, and just received the following from Raman Bhardwaj

I recently volunteered in downtown GSO to support the Black lives matter movement, and painted two temporary murals outside the Little Brother brewing. The intent of these images is to spread love, peace and remind people to love each other.

I also created an illustration showing a white and a black kid hugging each other with a peace sign next to them. This illustration is featured on a digital billboard at Kotis Street Art, Battleground Ave. Greensboro. I also printed stickers of this illustration and am posting around the city and distributing free to whoever wants them just to spread love and peace.

I am also working on a 200 ft. long "superhero wall" in Greensboro commissioned by Kotis Street Art. In May, I volunteered to paint a box truck to support the healthcare workers. This was a project with a fundraising effort to "feed the frontliners" in Greensboro.

In May I also painted two large murals for a private property in Summerfield. The 13 ft high murals pay tributes to Basketball legends Michael Jordan and Kobe Bryant.
