Artist Support Grants About the Program

Artist Support Grants (formerly Regional Artist Project Grants) is a regional grant program to support individual artists during and following the COVID-19 pandemic. The Artist Support Grant (ASG) program expands the number of regional consortiums from 13 to 18 to ensure more equitable disbursement of funds to artists in rural and urban areas across the state. The program provides direct support to individual artists for professional and artistic development, either to enhance their skills and abilities to create work, or to improve their business operations and capacity to bring the work to audiences. Grants will range in awards from \$500 to \$2,000.

This program will provide financial support to committed, gifted individual artists and small, unincorporated groups of collaborating artists residing in Forsyth, Davidson, Davie, Guilford, and Randolph counties and is intended to support a broad range of talented artists in the genres of visual arts, performing arts, literary arts, music composition, choreography, and interdisciplinary arts. The program is operated in partnership with Arts Greensboro, Arts Davidson County, Davie County Arts Council, High Point Arts Council and The Randolph Arts Guild. Funding is provided by the N.C. Arts Council, a division of the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources.

Award Notification: By Friday, January 14, 2022

Project Period: January 1 - December 31, 2022

Interim Report: On or before Wednesday, June 15, 2022

Eligibility and Scope

The Artist Support Grant is intended to support a broad range of talented artists in the genres of visual arts, performing arts, literary arts, music composition, choreography, and interdisciplinary arts. Eligible candidates may be either emerging or established artists. Applicants should demonstrate a commitment to spending a significant portion of their time on their work as artists.

Individuals and Artists Collectives

· Individual artist and small unincorporated groups of collaborating artists are eligible to apply

Residency

• Artist must reside in the following counties Davidson, Davie, Forsyth, Guilford, or Randolph.

• Artists who have lived in the region (Region 11: Davidson, Davie, Forsyth, Guilford, Randolph) where they are applying continuously for at least one year prior to the consortium's application deadline.

• Applicants must be at least 18 years old and either a U.S citizen or permanent resident alien.

• Artists who have lived in more than one region should apply only where they spend the majority of the year. Example, 183 Days

• All members of a collaborating team must be North Carolina residents, live in the region where they are applying, and meet the other eligibility requirements. Résumés documenting residence from all team members should be included with the application.

Multiple Awards

• Artists who are sole properties of organizations that have already received funding for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 from the North Carolina Arts Council are ineligible to apply

Opportunity (continued)

Conflicts-of-Interest

• Current board and staff members of the participating partner organizations and their family members are not eligible to apply for the award.

Student Status

• The Artist Support Grant is intended for adult, nonstudent artists. Artists enrolled full-time in undergraduate or associate degree-granting programs may not apply for the grant.

Artists in certificate programs are generally eligible.

• Artists pursuing graduate degrees in subjects other than their art form may be eligible if they meet the other eligibility criteria.

Eligible Projects and Costs

In project year 2021-2022, applicants may apply for up to 50 percent of the grant to support artist fees.

• Completion/Presentation of a New Work — Cost of resources necessary to complete or present a significant new work (e.g., purchasing art supplies or equipment (digital may qualify) or space rental)

• Career Promotion — Projects aimed at advertising artists' work and/or demonstrating their skill level (e.g., websites, portfolios, audio-visual documentation, and online presentation)

• Training — Costs to attend a class or workshop (in-person or virtual) aimed either at enhancing the artist's skill level or professional development (e.g., a master class or workshop taught by acknowledged authorities in the applicant artist's medium)

• Travel — Costs of transportation, lodging, and food for training, professional conferences, or research as allowed or possible while adhering to social distancing guidelines

• Services — Rental of equipment or facilities for presentation of a new work, recording studio space, etc.

 Supplies — Purchase of supplies and materials necessary for the completion or production of a new work deemed by the artist to be an essential work in his/her career.

• Artist Fee — Costs of labor, equals the time that one spends of a project. (Two ways to show a reasonable artist fee is by the hour and/or by the month)

Ineligible Projects and Costs

Ineligible Projects and Costs

- Scholarships for undergraduate- or graduate-level education
- Projects that support or oppose a particular candidate for public office
- · Projects that are exclusive to members of a particular religious faith group

Nonprofit initiatives

• Projects that do not have a direct effect on the applicant's growth as an artist (e.g., the promotion of other artists' work)

Evaluation Criteria

Artistic Merit (50%)

Demonstrated talent in an art form and overall excellence of the artist's work

Evidence of originality, inventiveness, and/or cultural significance in the art work

Project Merit(25%)

Feasibility (well-organized, shows preparation and planning) of the proposed project Clear, well-thought out and informative budget


Professional Development (25%)

Clear commitment to a career as a practicing professional artist

Benefit of the proposed project to the artist's professional growth

The Food for Thought Pantry is housed in the WSFCS Social Work Office downtown at City Market. It is supported through generous contributions from Mt. Tabor United Methodist Church and other local community partners and individuals. The pantry serves any one of our 55,000 students who may be experiencing food insecurity. Social workers receive referrals and assess the need before taking food to their home. With over half of our 55,000 children qualifying for free and reduced lunch there is an enormous need in our community. Providing children with these basic needs allows them to have a better chance at succeeding in school as well as leading healthier and happier lives.
