Clifton Taylor is an artist living in Winston-Salem. An internationally recognized theatrical designer, author and lecturer, he is always interested in the subjects of Color and Light. His painting work, most often working in oil with occasional forays into other media, is usually done Plein Air. His work is most closely allied with the Cape School of Art, an American Impressionist school. He has been spending summers in Cape Cod, MA and Santa Fe, NM and spends rest of his time in Winston-Salem, where he on the faculty of the NC School of the Arts.

Mark Cole is an emerging artist who plans to dismantle your ideas of redemption and embrace social justice reform while doing so. Born and raised in Upstate New York, now a resident of Winston-Salem, North Carolina, Mark has a devotion for creation, advocacy, and accountability- which breathes life into every aspect of his art.

A succinct explanation of Mark's artistic inspiration can best be expressed in the words of the artist himself: "The creative process for me is one that is both automatic and emotional. The majority of my works are inspired by first looking at the world as a beautiful pallet of God's love. One of the "tools" that I use to express my inspiration is realized through the music I listen to - from the beat, lyrics, and emotions I feel from the music - while I am creating. For me, creating my art is like being on a roller-coaster; ups and downs, highs and lows, twists and turns. Painting for me, like life, is constant movement and constant change. The creation process is cathartic, allowing my emotions to spill out onto my canvas as a release and hopefully an inspiration to others."

Bring your extra notions, fabric, machines, findings, and supplies to sell or trade. You are responsible for pricing and merchandising your own bazaar "stall."

1 Found A Quilted Heart' Project (IFAQH) Challenge

The "I found A Quilted Heart" project is a response to rampant alienation, grief, and profound loneliness resulting from two years of COVID. The «FAQH community of volunteers place small (3.5"), quilted hearts around the globe to brighten the day of a stranger. I think this is such a wonderful idea, I decided to use this retreat to promote the effort. I will provide all kinds of do-dads for you to use although, I'm sure you have your own and maybe will bring some to share as well. The rules are "common sense":

- . Do not hand, give or gift hearts to people (Hearts need to be "found")
- Do not leave hearts on personal or private property, such as a front porch, rehisle, door, bicycle, mailbox, gate, little libraries, etc. (Not random)
- De not leave kearts in places that are not public; hotel rooms, work desk, break rooms, office, private retreat, etc. (Not public)
- Do not leave hearts inside any kind of retail store or an retail displays. (Can be mistaken for merchandise.)
- Do not leave hearts in airports. [Hemeland security does not approve]
- Do not leave hearts in National Parks, Wilderness, Forests, Monuments, Bureau of Land Managements, or other Federal Public Lands seems. (Federal Regulation Fitte Ja. 222 (a)) Do not Leave hearts in botheroms, restrooms, washrooms, etc. (Unsanitare)
- Do not leave in places where they may be thrown away by staff. (Super Sad)
- Can I add scriptures, crosses, or centiments to my hearts?
 Hope, We the gestalatic tags have some you can capy or use. On not add any other words/phosper-at all. This includes words an embellishments.



Examples of good places to 'sow' hearts: A local park, hiking trail, highway rest stop, community center, outdoor shopping center, town square, foyer of public place, community bulletin board, beach, nature trail, museum, teurist attraction, trees, shrubberg, and fences in downtown.
