
"2018 Unbound and Unleashed" showcases AFAS artists with a variety of artworks in a range of prices. These


artworks are inspired by a published work of literature. This could be nonfiction, a novel, poetry, biography, comic book, essay, music, etc.

Found Objects Recycled by C.B. Tatum C.B.'s work predominantly consists of recycled materials like license plates, drink cans, and


barn tin - found objects. He makes amazing birdhouses, flower sculptures, etc.




